Oil Painting (with or without solvents) Suggested Materials List

• Brushes — Synthetic bristle (Princeton 6300 is a good series) or natural bristle (traditional oils only)

Size numbers vary by manufacturer; go by inch measure

- #8 (3/4") filbert, ideally two of these, for dark and light colors
- * #6 (1/2") flat, ideally two of these
- #4 (3/8") filbert, ideally, two of these
- #6 or #8 round synthetic, ideally, two of these
- · Painting panel or canvas, and/or oil paper
- Painting panel ("Gessobord" or canvas panel) or pre-stretched canvas, 8x10" or 9x12"
- And/or oil paper pad ("Arches Oil Paper", "Canson Canva-Paper"), 9x12" pad
- Painting knife or palette knife Preferably painting knife with elongated diamond shape, roughly 2" long
- Sketchbook for initial sketch, & pencil or markers
- Palette or palette paper pad 9x12" pad
- Cardboard box to carry your wet painting
- Optional Masterson Stay-Wet "Painter's Palette", a palette with a sealing lid that can keep your paint fresh for longer, 11 3/4" x 12 3/4", fits 9x12" palette paper pad
- Paint (water mixable oils)

Holbein Aqua Duo water-mixable oil paint in these colors will be provided for the workshop

along with medium and thinner. (I do not recommend W&N Artisan water mixable oils.)

The "core palette" of provided colors:

- Ultramarine Blue
- Cadmium Yellow (or Cadmium Yellow Pale or Light not Cadmium Yellow Light "Hue")
- Alizarin Crimson
- Burnt Sienna
- Phthalo Green (or Viridian)
- Titanium White

For those painting in traditional oils with their own paint

- Paint You're welcome to bring colors you have, but color mixing with a limited palette will be demonstrated with the "core palette" listed above.
- Solvent Odorless mineral spirits (for example, Gamsol)
- Painting Medium Preferably slow drying rather than Liquin (or add 1 part mineral spirits to 2 parts thickened linseed oil or stand oil)
- Jar, palette cups, containers
- Jar with lid for odorless mineral spirits
- Palette cups (ideally with lids), or small jars with lids, for using mineral spirits and medium while painting
- You might also want a thin tall jar for holding brushes while you paint.
